
Join us in person for the Opening of MASKED, Friday, May 6 from 4-7 PM at the St. Johnsbury Athenaeum. This Juried exhibit will travel statewide during 2022-2023. The exhibit is presented by Inclusive Arts Vermont and runs through July 8 at the Athenaeum. Visit our website at www.stjathenaeum.org and click on the MASKED tab for more information.

MASKED features visual artwork by 22 Vermont artists with disabilities. Each piece offers the artist's creative expression of the title – which arose in the early moments of the global pandemic. The work included is as complex and layered as the meaning of the word "masked" itself. The artists explore protection, disguise, veiling, all that is enshrouded, and what lies beneath.

All exhibition host galleries are physically accessible, and the exhibition will provide accessible program and communication features coordinated by Inclusive Arts Vermont. This includes, but is not limited to: verbal descriptions, audio tours, large print, braille, and gallery tours.

Archer Mayor

Archer Mayor is the author of the highly acclaimed Vermont-based mystery series featuring detective

Joe Gunther, which the Chicago Tribune describes as "the best police procedurals being written in America." His newest book, Marked Man, will be released on September 24th.


Protagonist Gunther once worked for the Brattleboro, Vermont, police department and is now a Special Agent for the fictional Vermont Bureau of Investigation. Books about his case-solving prowess have appeared once a year since 1988 and been published in five languages (if you count British). They routinely gather high praise from such sources as The New York Times, Washington Post, Los Angeles Times, and the New Yorker, often appearing on annual ten best lists.

Mayor's novels are rooted in actual field experience. Closely aligned to the Gunther series is the author's own background in Vermont working variously as a police officer and a firefighter/EMT over the past thirty years. Currently, he still works as a medico-legal death investigator for the state's medical examiner. This background adds depth, detail, and veracity to his characters and their struggles, and enhances the accuracy of his books. He was brought up in the US, Canada and France.
